

Overview

Information about attendance at accident and emergency departments due to an assault can help enrich the picture of violence against the person. It helps improve our understanding of the victims, locations and gravity of the assault.

Data is provided by East Lancashire Hospitals NHS Trust (Burnley), Blackpool Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (Preston and Chorley), University Hospitals of Morecambe Bay NHS Trust (Lancaster), Southport and Ormskirk Hospital Trust (Lancashire residents only) to the trauma intelligence and injury group (TIIG) at Liverpool John Moore's University, who aggregate it and supply it to MADE. Completion rates and quality of data completed do vary between hospital trusts and even from month to month. Please refer to the completion rate tables for the most up to date information.

Population data for rates and profiles comes from the Office for National Statistics and uses the latest mid-year estimates (2017 for districts).

In accordance with the data sharing protocol, this data can only be used for the purpose of improving and promoting community safety within Lancashire. It is not for public dissemination.

Navigation

Power BI dashboards sometimes work better in Google Chrome than Internet Explorer.

The links on the right will take you to the individual pages. Alternatively, clicking on the 'of' between the page numbers at the bottom of this dashboard will bring up a quick menu where you can select the page, or you can move between the pages by using the arrows adjacent to the page numbers.

Use the filters on each page to look at the district or hospital trust. Clicking on the focus mode on the top right corner of each chart/visualisation will open it on a separate page for easier viewing. Hovering over a data point will give you the value and any additional relevant data.

For drilldown charts, hover over the top of the chart to make the arrows visible. The left hand arrows sort the data by the second drilldown. Turn the right hand arrow on and then click on a bar chart to drill down into the data.










Assault attendees ethnic profile

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

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
Mode of arrival

TIIG (AED data)

Three types of data:

- Assault data shared with all MADE partners via our restricted microsite and visualised using our TIIG dashboard
- Commercially sensitive data around specific premises. Information such as which licensed premises have the most assaults associated with them. Data sent monthly to specific personnel in licensing and public health.

TIIG (AED data)

Three types of data:

- Assault data shared with all MADE partners via our restricted microsite and visualised using our TIIG dashboard
 - Commercially sensitive data around specific premises. We keep a 12 month running total of assaults in specific premises and the last drink location before an assault which are shared with all the licensing officers and public health leads in the three local authorities in Lancashire.
 - All injuries data for use by our public health analysts
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Some examples of how TIIG data adds to our intelligence?

- Community safety strategic assessment – the assault data has been used alongside that from the police and ambulance service to build a picture of where, when and what the issues are around violence against the person – a strategic priority in Lancashire.
 - Licensing decisions – such as whether a bar should extend their hours, improve their security, change to plastic glasses or be allowed to hold a licence.
 - Funding bids eg for knife crime – AED weapon detail adds to the picture of knife crime held by police.
 - Service redesign (falls) – over 65s attendances at AED for a fall.
