A major public health problem



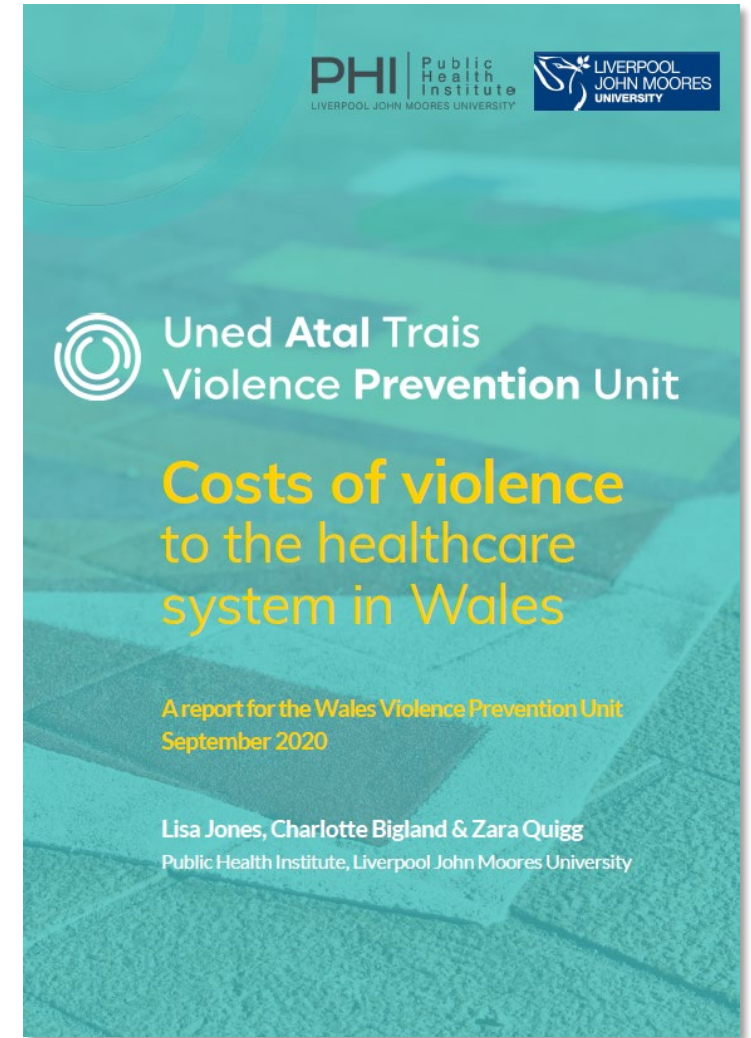
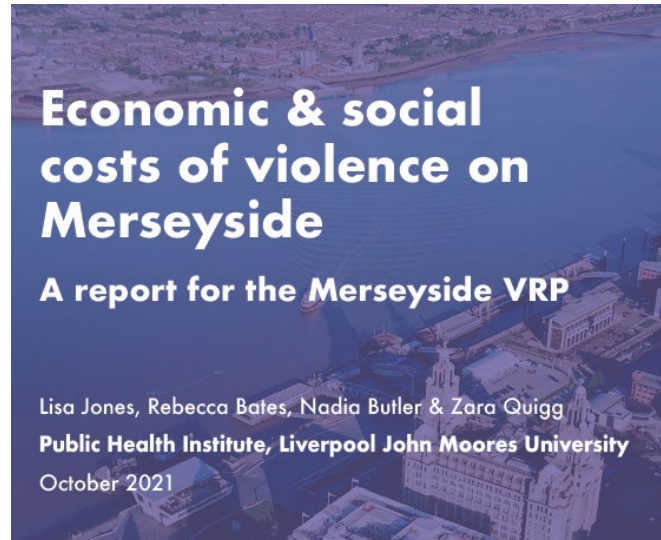
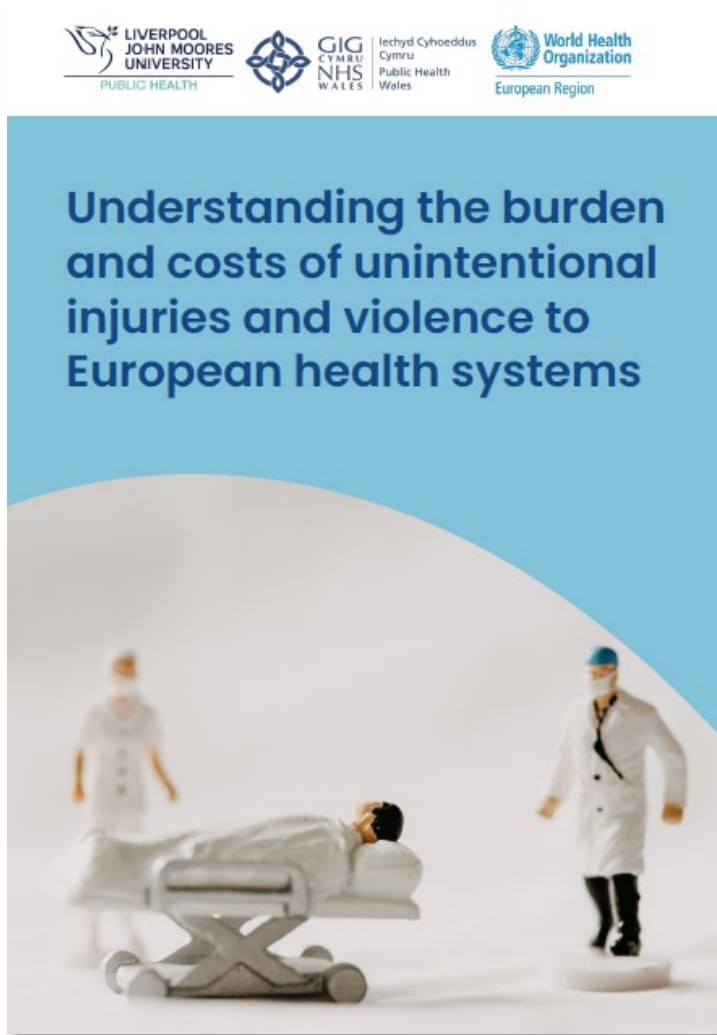
- Nearly half a million deaths due to violence and injuries in the WHO European Region in 2016
- The burden from violence and injuries affects families, communities, and wider society
- Co-exist and intersect with other root causes of poor health and wellbeing in society

Making the case on economic grounds



- Clear public health argument for investing in violence and injury prevention
- Continue to spend more on treating the ‘downstream’ impacts of violence
- Economic evidence is needed to help policy makers to understand how to prioritise investment in violence and injury prevention
