

Monthly Bulletin: April 2009 to March 2010

This bulletin provides a breakdown of all injury attendances at Macclesfield District General Hospital Emergency Department (ED) between April 2009 and March 2010.




Figure 1: Gender of injury attendances by month, April 2009 to March 2010

Between April 2009 and March 2010 there were 26,761 ED attendances. Injury attendances peaked in June (n=2,478), with February (n=1,774) having the least number of injury attendances (**Figure 1**).

For all months there were more male injury attendances than female presenting at Macclesfield District General Hospital ED (54%).




Figure 2: Age group of injury attendances by month, April 2009 to March 2010

Figure 2 presents the age group of injury attendances. Across the whole year the majority of injury attendances were made by individuals aged 30-59 years.

Table 1 details the injury group of injury attendances. The majority of injury attendances were classified as 'other injury' (86%), 7% were

recorded as sports injuries and 3% road traffic collisions (RTCs).

Table 2 illustrates the source of referral for patientspresenting with injuries. The majority (73%) of injuryattendees self-referred.

Table 3 presents injury attendances by location of incident. Over a third (39%) of all injury locations were recorded as other and 28% recorded as public place.

Table 4 shows the discharge destination of injuryattendances. Over half (57%) of attendees weredischarged.

Assault attendees presenting at Macclesfield District General Hospital ED between April 2009 and March 2010 were mainly male (74%) and the majority (44%) were aged between 18 and 29 years of age. **Table 5** shows the primary location of assault was recorded as other (48%).
